- To earn a bachelor's degree, all graduates must successfully complete a minimum of 120 credit hours.
- Minimum of 30 credits must be taken at Centenary University.
- All RN-BSN graduates must have a minimum of 2.5 GPA in their major(s).
- Credits can be shared between the core and the major, or between the core and minor. But credits cannot be shared *within* the core: a particular course can count only once within the core.
- Must earn a C or better in all nursing and major-related courses.**
- An active, unencumbered RN license will earn 20CR toward a BSN.
- Nursing elective courses are offered for students that transfer in University Core Credits and all Nursing Pre-requisite Courses to attain 120 credits required for graduation.
